Notes on Treasurer's Report, June 26, 2018

Banking analysis shows that the total library fund balance stands at \$747,763 (and change.) The actual Bank balances with interest included up to May 31 total \$751,124, made up of: 271 = 317,465,471 = 106,298,471 = 327,361.

The total is approximately \$8,983 less than last month. Difference between what county shows as Fund Balance and what we know Bank balance to be is about \$3,361, about \$1,248 of which is interest on our CD's. Can't explain the other \$1,100.

Turning to the Revenues and Expenditures reports: Expenditures are \$24,013 for the month, and \$122,718 YTD. Penal Fines are very slow, at only \$28,170 YTD, which is \$15,580 less than targeted.

We've still not received expected State Ald, and are about \$6500 behind on that. We earned almost \$650 last month on our CD's at the two Credit Unions. Interest revenue should show up in the SBR when the County receives the statement at the end of the quarter in June.

We are pretty much staying on target for expenses; B/G maintenance is now back in line, and Professional Serv/Edu difference is coming down. For some reason, our attempt to establish a budget in 471 has not yet registered.



The Treasurer is cautiously optimistic that our new policy of submitting bills for payment as they arrive instead of holding for Board approval is having a positive effect on our ability to reconcile submitted versus reported back amounts.

Director's Report

26 June 2018

- Circulated items year-to-date (print, audiobooks, and DVDs) are 15,914 compared to 16, 359 in 2017. Our inter-library loans were 154 this past month, and there have been 3,043 digital downloads to date this year, compared to 2,822 in 2017. Individual computer sessions are 3,627 to date, which is virtually unchanged from last year. We're lagging behind ~65 adult print titles per month, although our print circulation is up in all other areas of the collection. We're continually making adjustments to how we allocate funds for collection purchases, but it's generally the case that we're struggling against space and budget constraints in order to meet patron demand.
- Attendance at library programs or outreach events was 745 this-past month. Our summer reading kickoff was attended by 136, and feedback from parents was very positive. Several parents commented to the effect that they were pleased the library is neither offering prizes nor tracking children via reading logs. They appreciated the focus on reading for pleasure and the summer reading journals we're distributing.
- Birch Street 2nd- and 3rd-graders, Cherry Street 4th-graders, the entire Rapid City student body, and the KPL summer school students, visited the library this past month.
- We're seeing a marked increase in student tutors using the library this month. We're also hosting area teens with disabilities.
- The library made the front page of the June 25th Record Eagle, with a nice article featuring Dawn Moses and Sarah Genereaux's summer "Adulting" classes.
- I was appointed to the board of the Kalkaska Conservation District this past month.
